Throughout this policy, the term "parents" means all those having parental responsibility for a child

The Academy blazer is to be worn at all times; however staff may give permission for blazers to be removed during lesson time.

The uniform is distinctive and is therefore easy to check.

All students must wear white shirts tucked into the waistband, grey trousers or skirts, black shoes, an Academy sweater and tie. Boys should wear black or white socks and girls should wear white socks or black tights.

Staff should also ensure they are good role models in the matter of professional dress.

Students will NOT be allowed to wear:
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Combat jackets, hooded jackets, caps, badges, flags or slogans printed or sewn on jackets.◆ Trainers or very high-heeled shoes.◆ Jewellery, except for small plain studs (one per ear, which will be removed in PE lessons).◆ One plain finger ring will be allowed.
Please be aware that:
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Severe or extreme haircuts will be challenged.◆ All property must be clearly named.◆ Outdoor clothing should be removed upon entering a classroom.
We must all challenge:
<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Shirts worn outside trousers or skirts.◆ Sloppy wearing of ties.◆ Incorrect footwear - black shoes only.◆ Jackets, coats carried or worn.◆ Jewellery - only a watch, one plain ring, studs (one per ear) are allowed.◆ Earrings/nose studs must not be worn.

It is crucial that we are vigilant and ensure that students are smart. The standards we set will determine how the community perceives us.

Tutors should mark in journals if students are not in correct uniform, or are wearing it incorrectly. All this information is in the Student Journal.

The B4L Team have a standardised letter that Learning Tutors may use to contact home.

Throughout this policy, the term “parents” means all those having parental responsibility for a child

Stage 1; for the initial occasion in a half-term that an item of uniform is not worn. Students should carry a **green** Uniform Exemption card. Exemption card returned at the end of the day.

Stage 2; for the second occasion in a half-term that an item of uniform is not worn. Students should carry an **amber** Uniform exemption card - L.T. informed on this occasion and may wish to intervene here. Exemption card returned at the end of the day.

Stage 3; for the third occasion in a half-term that an item of clothing is not worn. Students should carry a **red** Uniform Exemption card - L.T. informed of parent contact via phone call/letter. Exemption card returned at the end of the day.

Stage 4; On the fourth occasion in a half term that correct uniform is not worn, Learning Tutor to be informed - Students are to be set a 'Community Service' style detention with their Learning Tutor and are to be given a written dated note from student services (See attached)

Stage 5; 'Repeat offenders'; Students may be sent home at the start of the day to change into the appropriate uniform - Recommended in the new guidelines by the DCSF (See below) providing there is an agreement between parents/carers and the Academy when contact is made. On occasions where parents/carers cannot be contacted, students are referred to Assistant DoL B4L/DoL B4L KS3/4 and students will be placed into Isolation for the day/or until correct uniform is sourced

DCSF Guidance on uniform -

'A headteacher or a person authorized by the headteacher may ask a student to go home briefly to remedy a breach of the Academy's rules on appearance or uniform. This should be for no longer than is necessary to remedy the breach. This is not an exclusion, but an authorized absence for one/two lessons. However, if the student continues to breach uniform rules in such a way as to be sent home to avoid Academy, or takes longer than is strictly necessary to effect the change, the student's absence may be counted as unauthorized absence'.

For each stage, names of students are recorded at student services on a Uniform log (See attached). These stages to continue in effect for one half-term; each student goes back to exemption stage one at the beginning of each new half term.

- Consistent approach by all staff - All staff to ask students to display their Exemption card if not in the correct uniform. If students have no card/note from student services, they are to be sent to Student Services to collect one
- Members of staff on patrol to carry out random uniform spot-checks in corridors/breaks and lunch-times

Medium / Long-term impact

Throughout this policy, the term "parents" means all those having parental responsibility for a child

- Link uniform to Positive comments on eportal. Learning Tutors to log positive comments about individual students who support the Academy ethos and represent the Academy well by wearing appropriate uniform - logs to be completed during extended form time
- Uniform exchange service at Student Services. Students are able to loan certain items of uniform, instead of being given an Exemption card - which may lead to parent/L.T. or DoL B4L intervention - students will be given the option. Items of clothing to include Ties and Blazers. (Current year 11 students may be asked to leave items of clothing at the Academy after they leave - these could be used as items of loan).
