














#### The Holocaust Educational Trust

Tomi Komoly, a Holocaust Survivor, visited the Academy this week to talk to Year 9 students about his experiences during the 2<sup>nd</sup> World War. The students have been studying the atrocities of the Holocaust in their Humanities lessons and Tomi's harrowing account of what his family and countless other Jews experienced reminded us all of the terrible consequences of a doctrine based on superiority, prejudice and hatred. We will always remember Tomi's visit and cannot thank him enough for his time.







#### **Captain Lou Rudd MBE**

Droylsden Academy was privileged to host a visit from Captain Lou Rudd MBE this week when he shared the experiences of his expedition to cross the Antarctic single handed.

Captain Rudd started his 'Spirit of Endurance' expedition on 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2018 and completed the 56 day journey, a 920 mile solo unsupported crossing of the Antarctic land mass, without a single day's rest, becoming the first Briton, and only the second man in history, to complete this journey.

It took 41 days to travel from the start point to the South Pole and a further 15 days from the South Pole to Ross Ice Shelve via the Leverett Glacier. Captain Rudd showed the students the pulk (sled) which he hauled across Antarctica, with a start weight of 130kg, his clothing and his skis. The pulk had to hold all of the food and equipment he would need for the expedition as the trip was solo and unassisted so he wasn't allowed to resupply at any point. Careful consideration had to be given to what he would take with him so that Captain Rudd could keep the weight of the pulk to an absolute minimum. This was so important that he decided not to take a change of clothing for the entire trip!

Captain Rudd shared some of his experiences on his journey including falling of a sheer drop resulting in a spectacular 'face plant' in the snow closely followed by his pulk landing on top of him. He endured temperatures of -57°C and completed the journey in what has been acknowledged as some of the harshest conditions on record with unprecedented levels of snow fall making it even more exhausting to haul the pulk across 920 miles.

At the end of his journey, Captain Rudd realised that bad weather meant he would have to wait a further three days for the aeroplane that would fly him to civilisation and, with every scrap of food gone, things were not looking good. Fortunately, a box of supplies had been buried under one of the aviation fuel drums a year before the expedition had started just in case this situation ever arose so Captain Rudd was saved by a box containing cheeses, meats and coffee!

Since returning from Antarctica, Captain Rudd has been visiting schools to inspire students through sharing the experiences of his epic journey. He really inspired the 200 students who attended his presentation at the Academy and we are really grateful that that he gave up his time to visit us.
