'Rest in Peace Dec, we will love and miss you forever.'


'Declan, you were such a positive person and our memories of you still make us smile.'

Thank you to all those parents and carers who completed our recent survey. The information you have provided will play a really important part in our self-evaluation and future planning. As key stakeholders in the Academy, your honest views and opinions are crucial to our continuing development and improvement.

Clearly, it is important that students feel safe and happy at school and I was pleased that 97% of you agreed that your child felt safe and that 92% of you felt that your child was happy at the Academy. Whilst the results to the survey were pleasing, we will be talking to a small number of parents and carers to see what more we can do to support those children who do not necessarily feel secure or happy at school.

Student behaviour at the Academy was judged as good at our last OFSTED Inspection and, again, I was pleased that 90% of respondents agreed with this too. Clearly, managing, encouraging and ensuring good behaviour in a large school is essential, and an absolute pre-requisite to high standards of progress and achievement, and I would like to thank the overwhelming majority of our parents and carers for their absolute support in ensuring high standards.

In terms of progress and achievement, I was pleased that 94% of parents and carers feel that we have high expectations of and for their child and that 90% felt that their child was doing well. It was also pleasing to note that 94% of our students felt that they were taught well when they completed their survey. Clearly, we will continue to do all we can to inspire and engage all our students so that everyone has the appropriate provision and opportunity to achieve their potential.

Finally, I was pleased that 95% of parents and carers would recommend the Academy to others, an important measure of your confidence in our school. Again, whilst this represents a very high level of parental satisfaction, we will be looking at how we can improve further and gain the confidence of all our parents and carers.

If any parents indicated that they would like to speak with a member of the Leadership Team, then someone will contact them over the next week or so. Thank you again for your support.

We launched School Gateway at <u>Droylsden</u> Academy in July 2018, a parent engagement app that allows you to pay for trips, communicate with the school and view your child's achievements at anytime from anywhere.

To stay up to date with what's going on at school make sure you download the app for free. Just search *School Gateway* in your App store and download. Simple.



NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY

Borrowbox



You may remember from past editions of Newsflash that, earlier this year, we launched the 'BorrowBox' app with Year 7 students.

Students with 'Borrowbox' can download e-books and audio e-books free of charge onto several devices. If a student is reading a book on BorrowBox on their phone or tablet at home, they just need to login to their account on a school computer and they can carry on where they left off! There is also no need to worry about returning library books when they are due as the app automatically returns the book to the library itself!

Students can also access all of the other resources available online from their library, including 'PressReader' for newspapers and magazines and 'Britannica Online' for research and homework, as well as checking the catalogue for physical books and looking at their own account.

We are now launching 'Borrowbox' with Year 8 and hope as many of them as possible will sign up. To download the app and join the scheme, students must be a member of their local Library. Library application forms are available from your local Library or from Mrs Godrich in the Droylsden Academy Library. Parents should complete the form with their child and must sign it. Applications can't be processed without a signature from a parent/carer. Once completed, application forms should be returned to Mrs Godrich who will send the forms off for you. Your child's Library card will then be sent to the Academy and he/she will then be able to download the 'Borrowbox' App. Easy!




DATES FOR YOUR DIARY

Our On Board Centre (OBC) is a room situated in our Learning Support Department which provides a wide range of support for students to allow them to thrive academically and be successful in school. It was recognised by Ofsted in our most recent inspection for the excellent support it provides.

Students are referred to the On Board Centre by the school's pastoral team for a variety of reasons; for example, because they are experiencing health issues (physical or mental) which are making it hard for them to be in class, because they have experienced something difficult or upsetting outside of school or because they are struggling to manage aspects of their behaviour.

Students will work for a set period of time in the OBC and, while there, they complete work set by their class teachers under the supervision and guidance of the OBC Team - expectations of students when working in the OBC are the same as they are elsewhere in the school and we insist on very high standards.

We are looking for the right person to join this team in supporting and managing students in the On Board Centre, liaising with class teachers and other staff in school to ensure that, during their stay in the OBC, students work hard, remain safe and receive the support they need to resume their learning back in class.
